A Prayerful Litany upon the 175th Anniversary of Brook Hill Church (United Methodist)

Leader: Almighty and gracious God - Creator of the Universe, Bringer of Life and Salvation; the Hope and Sustainer throughout time: We are forever grateful for the service and sacrifice of ancestors, known and unknown, who envisioned a faith community here on this hill in Yellow Springs. We are filled with anticipation of what might yet take place through the people now assembled and the ministry yet to be discovered.

All: With respect for the past, we now live in the present, looking towards the future: O God of history and purpose.

Leader: With thanksgiving, we celebrate the Christian education that has taken place to prepare generations of children, youth, and adults to learn and live by the stories of Jesus. With joy in our hearts, we remember the walls of this, and previous sanctuaries, filled with musical praise and adoration. We are lifted by the laughter and feasting that has happened in moments of celebration and fellowship. We are blessed through the various pastors' preaching and the leadership of committed lay leaders who have modeled Christian maturity and service. In this place, we entered the divine mysteries of Baptism given and Holy Communion shared, each reminding us who we are and whose we are. We gathered here in this place to say goodbye to faith community friends through funerals and memorial services and welcomed new love through marriages and acknowledgements of new births.

Leader: With anticipation, we look towards the unrevealed tomorrow. As we greet longtime friends, we open wide the doors of our church to welcome strangers to join us on the journey of faith. With joy, we listen to scripture read and proclaimed, songs and anthems sung to Your glory, children recitations, youth offered questions, men and women in service to 'the least, the last and the lost,' with dialogue and discourse on the "Word made Flesh' that dwells with us and reminds us that "...neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.'

All: With respect for the past, we now live in the present, looking towards the future: O God of 1850, 1950, 2000, 2025, 2050, and beyond.

Leader: May we, the Congregation of Brook Hill United Methodist Church, on this day at this time ever remain, "Standing on the Promises of Christ, Our King, through eternal ages let His praises ring; Glory in the highest, we will shout and sing, Standing on the promises of God." May we, the women and men at the intersection of Yellow Springs, Indian Springs, Bethel, and Hamburg roads, become a gathering place for all persons who seek to grow in love of God and love of neighbor, all the while proclaiming, "God of grace and God of glory, on thy people pour thy power, crown thine ancient church's story, bring her bud to glorious flower. Grant us wisdom, grant us courage, for the facing of this hour, for the facing of this hour."

All: With respect for the past, we now live in the present, looking towards the future: In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. In the name of the Creator, the Redeemer and the Sustainer. In the name of the one who was and is and is to come, the Almighty, now and forever. Amen and Amen.


